I look forward to working with each of you over this next year as we move LMDSS forward.

Making Change One Voice At A Time: The Ministry of Social Development and Social Innovation is eliminating the \$45 BC Bus Pass annual administration fee for people with the Persons with Disabilities (PWD) designation. The fee normally charged when people on disability assistance applied for, or renewed, their bus pass will be eliminated as part of the Sept. 1, 2016, disability assistance rate changers

Their bus passes will no longer have an expiry date of Dec. 31, 2016. The bus pass will be valid for as long as an individual wants to keep it.

This provides more flexibility, they can decide to opt out of the BC Bus Pass program and receive their \$52 transportation support allowance on their assistance cheque. They can also opt back into the BC Bus Pass program in the

future.

The decision to eliminate the administration fee is in direct response to input from people with disabilities, stakeholders and advocates.

It also builds on the changes that take effect on Sept 1st. The B.C. Government has invested \$170 million over the next three years to ensure all 100,000 people on disability assistance will receive \$52.00 transportation support, added, as well as, a \$25.00 increase for a total of \$77.00 per month.

Clients already receiving a \$66.00 Special Transportation Subsidy will continue to receive that support, as well as, an additional \$11.00 increase for a total of 77.00 per month.

People with the PWD designation who want to return their BC Bus Pass and receive the \$52 transportation support allowance on their cheque can inform the ministry of their decision by calling 1 866 866-0800, or emailing the BC Bus Pass program at: SDSIBUS-PA@gov.bc.ca.

Her quiet flat neighbourhood was the ideal place for her to try one of the specialized bikes designed for people with disabilities.


The bikes come in various sizes and the handle bars, seat & pedals adjust to your size.

Dear Theresa,

I write to let you know that Grace landed in Canada today with her three siblings and became a permanent residents of Canada.

Up until the afternoon of June 3, the Immigration Minister's office was still considering giving Grace a temporary status as a visitor. Suddenly a few hours later, a final decision of this positive and humane outcome was arrived at in the middle of the night of June 3 by the officers in two visa offices in Europe and Africa. You can imagine the stress Anitha - the aunt - had to endure up until that point.

Anitha flew a marathon of 60 hours to and from Burundi in the last 3 days and managed within a few hours that she had in the city to go shopping for these beautiful outfits for the journey! Don't the children look gorgeous and happy despite the 30-hours transit? I believe the entire family is still in shock that this faint dream finally came true after four years of waiting, lots of prayers and hard work.

Moreover, everything that needed to happen in the past week happened precisely the way we could humanly control/plan which included couriering Grace's passport from the Canadian embassy in Kenya to Canada and having Anitha go into Burundi where violence was getting more volatile to bring the kids to Canada.

These two pictures were taken at the Toronto International airport this morning of this happy family are quite special.

I know Anitha is taking your advice, about getting Grace's problem eye checked ASAP, seriously. So as soon as the children are settled down, Anitha will start seeking treatments and assessments for Grace. The money she's raised for Grace's medical needs will be put into good use now. I hope she will visit you and your centre with Grace in the near future. In the meanwhile, if you have any suggestions or advice for Anitha, please

feel free to let me know. I am more than happy to pass it on to her or ask her to get in touch soon.

Finally, please know that your letter of support was tremendously helpful as it led to this favourable decision. Thank you for unequivocal support and advocacy for little Grace.
