The LMDSS wanted to provide the following information to families looking for Occupational Therapy assessments.

With regards to occupational therapy assessments (at no cost) for children with special needs coming from low income families. Swift Health Services will provide OT assessments for children with a variety of diagnosis including Autism, Down Syndrome, ADHD, developmental coordination disorder, Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and many more.

Many children with special needs have difficultly accessing services (i.e. Variety etc.) until they have an assessment completed by a professional. The assessment is often a financial barrier preventing special needs children from accessing occupational therapy services. Therefore, we offer free occupational therapy services to children with special needs coming from low income families.
